WE NEED YOUR ASSISTANCE TO DECIDE ON POTENTIAL FUTURE COMMUNITY SPORTS FACILITIES IN FILEY

Ebor Academy Filey, Filey Town Council, Scarborough Borough Council and North Yorkshire Police are working together in partnership to provide new community sport and leisure facilities in Filey and need to identify the demand for these amenities together with the best mix of them to ensure that it suits local need and can be used as evidence to support external funding bids. The partnership is consulting all households and sports groups in the Filey and Southern Area of the Borough for their views.

The proposed site for the new facilities is Ebor Academy Filey (formerly Filey School) on Muston Road, Filey. This location has been selected as it provides the best financial sustainability with the school working in partnership with the local community and is most likely to be successful in attracting external funding.

The proposed new amenity would provide exclusive local community access to a fitness suite and activity area seven days per week and some community access during the school day and during evenings, weekends and school holidays for usage of the sports hall, pitches and new 3G facilities. The school already has some supporting facilities such as car parking and an existing management structure within the school to operate the new amenity.

As the first phase of the project Ebor Academy are converting the existing tennis courts to an artificial grass surface area (with floodlights) which will allow all year round use for football, tennis, hockey, team games etc. It is intended that the facility will have community access and be completed by September this year.

Other sports and leisure facilities that have been identified as potential options include:-

- Sports hall suitable for badminton, five a side football, netball and volleyball
- Fitness suite with resistance and cardio vascular equipment and loose weights area
- Activity area for exercise classes, dance, martial arts and community events.

The proposal would involve the conversion/extension of the former indoor swimming pool to accommodate the indoor facilities mentioned above. Please find more information on the attached letter and questionnaire delivered with this newsletter. The options do not include a new swimming pool as this will be too costly to build and operate.

Fitness/exercise class areas have proved very popular in other towns with potential Membership options for regular users with unlimited access to the Fitness Suite and classes at approximately £15 - £20 per month or pay and play options. Early sign-up discounts will be available when fees are published. If you are interested in registering your details for this facility, please email admin@fs.ebor.academy with your email address and/or contact details, which will be treated in the strictest confidence.

FIRST FOR FILEY IN YORKSHIRE FILEY TOWN COUNCIL RECEIVES QUALITY AWARD IN NATIONAL SCHEME



Filey Town Council has received a prestigious award as part of the Local Council Award Scheme and is the first council in the whole of Yorkshire to have achieved the new Quality Award level. This achievement recognises that the council achieves good practice in governance, community engagement and council improvement. Moreover, Filey Town Council goes above and beyond their legal obligations, leading their communities and continuously seeking opportunities to improve and develop even further.

The Award Scheme report highlighted the council's particular areas of strength, including its deliverance of quality functions and services; its engagement with many sectors of the local community and the quality of information and documentation on its website which all met the new criteria for the Quality Level Award.

The Local Council Award Scheme is a peer assessed programme that has been designed to both provide the tools and encouragement to those councils at the beginning of their improvement journeys, as well as promoting and recognising councils that are at the cutting edge of the sector. It is through the sector working together to share best practice, drive up standards and supporting those who are committed to improving their offer to their communities that individual councils and the sector as a whole will reach its full potential.

Crescent Hill - Replacement Setts

Members of Filey Town Council have worked closely with North Yorkshire County Council and are pleased to announce that after several years of negotiations that the breaded cobbles on Crescent Hill are to be replaced with natural stone setts. Members of the Town Council have chosen the type and colour of the setts from three that were made available by North Yorkshire County Council and it is anticipated that this project can be achieved before winter this year.

Filey Neighbourhood Plan

Filey Town Council has submitted an expression of interest to the Borough Council's Forward Planning Department to draw up a Neighbourhood Plan for the parish of Filey, which will include all areas within the parish boundary of Filey, Primrose Valley, Hunmanby Gap, Royal Oak and Airey Hill.
