## July 2021

There were 136 incidents reported in Filey during July.

A resident used eBay to buy a vehicle. After contact was made a deposit of £600 has been paid to the seller via a bank transfer. Upon arrival to collect the vehicle, it transpired that the people at the address provided had no idea of the sale. The investigation into this matter is ongoing. Please remember to take all necessary precautions when buying expensive items online, always use the sites recommended method of payment to give yourself maximum protection.

We have received yet more reports of the dreaded National Insurance phone scam. This usually takes the format of an automated call encouraging the receiver to press a button to be put through to an operator. This is known as phishing as they are trying to obtain some of your personal details. The safest option if you or anyone you knows receives a call relating to anything to do with National Insurance, is to put the phone down. If it is genuine, they will have your address and write to you. Do not speak to them, press any buttons, or give out any details. **IF YOU HEAR THE WORDS NATIONAL INSURANCE ON AN AUTOMATED CALL, PUT THE PHONE DOWN.**

**02/07/2021 20:00** - A suspect was arrested after Police were made aware they had been jumping on the roof of a Police vehicle parked on John Street. They were later charged with Criminal Damage.

**08/07/2021 14:30** - A member of the public was stopped and searched by Officers on patrol. A small quantity of cannabis was located, they were arrested and received a cannabis warning in custody.

**10/07/2021 10:51** - An allegation was made from a shop on John Street that a person on a mobility scooter was refusing to leave and repeatedly swearing at the shop staff. Officers attended but the person had already left.

**15/07/2021 16:42** - Two bottles of vodka were stolen from Tesco in Filey. The matter is still under investigation.

**17/07/2021 12:29** – A two vehicle RTC occurred near to the entrance to Gardeners Court in Filey. One vehicle was seized by Police for having no insurance and a driver of one of the vehicles was taken to hospital with minor injuries.

**17/07/2021 20:35** - £60 of artificial grass was stolen from outside Tesco in Filey.

**18/07/2021 18:40** – A moped was stopped by Officers on patrol on Church Cliff Drive in Filey. The rider didn't have the correct license or insurance to ride it so was reported for these offences.

**19/07/2021 07:29** – A black Vauxhall Corsa parked on Belle Vue Street in Filey had its rear window smashed at some point overnight. There are no suspects or witnesses, nothing was stolen from within the vehicle.

**19/07/2021 16:19** – A holiday maker reported withdrawing £300 cash from The Post Office on John Street in Filey. The money was placed in their backpack and later discovered to be missing, presumed stolen by the reporting person.

We received 23 reports of concern for safety of individuals in your ward area during July. These incidents invariably relate to people in distress. We work closely with the Street Triage Mental Health Team at Cross Lane who carry Police radios with them, we also have support from Mental Health professionals who work in our control room. This is sadly becoming an increasing trend but we always ensure the people receive the best help available at the time and refer them to other agencies. If necessary, they are referred into the weekly meeting we have with other agencies from around the Borough where we can discuss courses of action to provide best support.

The average time taken to answer 101 calls in July 2021 was 310.68 seconds.

During July we dealt with 890 incidents across the area as a whole, a breakdown of these follows (not inclusive of all incidents): -

- 8 injury/death RTCs.
- 31 damage only RTCs.

- 46 road related offences, drink/drug driving, no insurance/license/dangerous driving/speeding etc...
- 73 reports of suspicious circumstances.
- 7 missing persons.
- 2 firearms incidents.
- 6 hoax calls.
- 3 Domestic Violence Disclosure Scheme – *commonly referred to as 'Clare's Law' The Scheme was introduced to set out procedures that could be used by the police in relation to disclosure of information about previous violent and abusive offending by a potentially violent individual to their partner where this may help protect them from further violent and abusive offending.*
- 66 domestic incidents/violence.
- 85 concern for safety incidents.
- 6 civil disputes.
- 4 animal incidents
- 20 highway disruptions
- 107 violence crimes.
- 10 sexual offences.
- 35 thefts.
- 0 stolen motor vehicles.
- 10 fraud or forgery.
- 7 drug offences.
- 20 criminal damages.
- 6 dwelling or commercial burglaries.
- 2 auto crimes.
- 79 anti-social behaviour reports.

If an incident of Anti-Social Behaviour occurs which you would like Police to deal with then please report this as soon as possible after the event to allow Officers the best chance to deal with the culprits. Please do not wait until next time you happen to bump into an Officer or Parish Councillor. It allows us to make connections with other incidents and deal with individuals for patterns of behaviour rather than incidents in isolation. It does not matter if no suspects have been seen or cannot be identified; we may have this reported on another nearby incident and be able to link them.

# Derwent & Hertford Rural Watch – August

Here we are in August already! Barbeques should be all fired up and everyone enjoying the sunshine 😊 but speaking of barbeques and fires – if you are going to have one outside, ensure you are careful with open fires or naked flames. When the ground is tinder dry, as it can be if we have had little or no rain, fires can start in a second so please be extremely careful with any naked flames; the last thing we need in this area are flash fires, especially if you are out and about in the forestry!

## **Bogus Callers and Online Security**

It is all too easy at times, especially when distracted, to fall victim of Internet crime. We have all had them, the emails supposedly from firms telling you to download this or that – but how do we know these emails are truly safe?

Firstly, look at the sender address (this is at the top of the email) where it says “from” – do you recognise the sender? If it is supposed to be from your bank, is it your bank email address, ensure it is **exactly** as it should be. If you are unsure, delete the email do NOT click on any links it contains, and contact your bank yourself because bank emails usually have some code word included that a Scammer would not have access to. If it is from a bank, you do not use then do not even open the email, just “bin it”.

If it is from a “get rich quick” scheme **always** assume that this is what is called a Scam. Scams have one thing in mind and that is to get as much money out of you as possible before you realise what is happening; sometimes their “targets” do not even realise they are being scammed because they are so good and convincing at it - but once all their money is gone, they the scammers are gone as well and with all your hard-earned savings as well – one victim in recent years was taken for over £60,000 and the scammers will have had no conscience about doing so!

Bogus Callers will call at your home and say “your roof needs repairing”, charge you exorbitant charges and do a bad job; or they will trick you into letting them into your home so they can steal whatever they can pick up without you noticing. They use distraction in order to rifle your purse/credit or bank cards/jewellery then slip away without you having a clue (until it is too late) that they have taken anything.

Always ensure you keep yourself and your family safe both online and in your home – ensure your anti-virus program is up-to-date and that any updates are installed for all programs ..... We can talk more about this another time, or I can come to your group and give you a talk if you wish? But the one main thing to remember is, your front door is your barrier. If in any doubt – **KEEP THEM OUT** – by shutting and bolting the door.
