## December 2021

There were 92 incidents reported in Filey during December.

**08/12/2021 21:43** – Police were alerted by a member of the public of an alarm going off at Filey junior school. Officers attended nothing appeared untoward and everything secure. Key holder attended with keys.

**09/12/2021 08:43hrs** – Criminal damage was reported to a vehicle on Wooldale Drive. All four tyres had been punctured overnight.

**18/12/2021 14:52** - Theft of wind screen wipers from a VW Golf was reported overnight on Station Road Filey, house to house enquires carried out and patrols will be stepped up due to concerns raised.

**18/12/2021 22:10** – An attempted burglary was reported on West Road. Reporting person states someone opened their outer door, was disturbed then ran off. Officers attended and completed an extensive area search with negative gain. They had already been in the area at the time and did not notice anything untoward. This was briefed out to all local Officers for their awareness.

We received 11 reports of concern for safety of individuals in your ward area during December. These incidents invariably relate to people in distress. We work closely with the Street Triage Mental Health Team at Cross Lane who carry Police radios with them, we also have support from Mental Health professionals who work in our control room. This is sadly becoming an increasing trend, but we always ensure the people receive the best help available at the time and refer them to other agencies. If necessary, they are referred into the weekly meeting we have with other agencies from around the Borough where we can discuss courses of action to provide best support.

The average time taken to answer 101 calls in December 2021 was 225 seconds.

During December we dealt with 704 incidents across the area as a whole, a breakdown of these follows (not inclusive of all incidents): -

- 10 injury/death RTCs.
- 27 damage only RTCs.
- 32 road related offences, drink/drug driving, no insurance/license/dangerous driving/speeding etc...
- 63 reports of suspicious circumstances.
- 14 missing persons.
- 0 firearms incidents.
- 7 hoax calls.
- 4 Domestic Violence Disclosure Scheme – *commonly referred to as 'Clare's Law' The Scheme was introduced to set out procedures that could be used by the police in relation to disclosure of information about previous violent and abusive offending by a potentially violent individual to their partner where this may help protect them from further violent and abusive offending.*
- 57 domestic incidents/violence.
- 76 concern for safety incidents.
- 8 civil disputes.
- 6 animal incidents
- 22 highway disruptions
- 56 violence crimes.
- 2 sexual offences.
- 14 thefts.
- 2 stolen motor vehicles.
- 6 fraud or forgery.
- 3 drug offences.
- 16 criminal damages.
- 5 dwelling or commercial burglaries.
- 4 auto crimes.

- 81 anti-social behaviour reports.

If an incident of Anti-Social Behaviour occurs which you would like Police to deal with then please report this as soon as possible after the event to allow Officers the best chance to deal with the culprits. Please do not wait until next time you happen to bump into an Officer or Parish Councillor. It allows us to make connections with other incidents and deal with individuals for patterns of behaviour rather than incidents in isolation. It does not matter if no suspects have been seen or cannot be identified; we may have this reported on another nearby incident and be able to link them.

### **North Yorkshire Community Messenger**

At the July MS Teams catch up with Police and Councils, it was asked about the possibility of North Yorkshire Community Messenger (NYCM) automatically posting to a Parish Council social media account or web site. Having spoken to our Corporate Communications department, in short, this isn't possible, but...

There is a share option on the bottom of each message, you can share it to a social media account or elsewhere via this. So, if you have an email list, or other distribution list set up of people who are not on community messenger then the messages can be shared to this in a few seconds.

NYCM is a format that all Community Officers have received recent training in and are planning to use more often. It takes a few seconds for you to sign up and receive regular updates about what's occurring in your neighbourhood.

# Derwent & Hertford Rural Watch – December

This time of year is never easy and with current financial constraints it can only get worse if we aren't all careful.

With potentially expensive Christmas gifts in the house, and perhaps going away for the Christmas holidays leaving homes unoccupied, this time of year may leave you vulnerable to theft and/or break ins. So, ensure your front and back doors are secure as they are your first line of defence. Invest in good quality door locks, which will provide the necessary security.

You could also use SMART technology and keyless locks to help protect your home; Smart technology can make your home look occupied even if you are away either for the day or for a holiday. Smart plugs can be set on timers or controlled automatically with some systems even have a built-in vacation mode to randomly turn lights on or off during evening or morning hours to give the appearance someone is home. So if you are tech-savvy you can really secure your home

There are those who prey on homes where packages are delivered when no-one is in; to avoid this happening, make sure you get deliveries for when you are in or have them delivered to a package bank or perhaps a neighbour if you know them well enough.

If you are going away for the Christmas festivities, please **DON'T** post it on social media!! You would be surprised how many openly say "I'm going away" then wonder how they have been burgled! So make it a practise not to state when or where you are going; if you have to tell friends, tell them face to face or by text message. Tighten up your social media security by not divulging your exact position, remove any mention of your marital status – just generally keep your private information just that – private!

## **Fire Safety at Christmas**

And as a fire security aside, check your Christmas lights for faults and don't leave them on overnight; check that bulbs do not need changing and if they do, buy good quality replacements to avoid the possibility of fire.
