May 2021

There were 111 incidents reported in Filey during May.

01/05/2021 15:43 - A report was received of vehicles racing around the old golf course at Filey Country Park. Officers attended but could not locate the vehicles. A short time later, one of them was seen and stopped by Officers on the A165 at Osgodby. The driver only had a provisional license and was with no one so his car was seized.

02/05/2021 11:08 - A three vehicle RTC was happened upon by Officers on patrol on Muston Road in Filey. All drivers exchanged details and no injuries were reported.

20/05/2021 14:04 – A fraud was reported by a resident whereby they received a call on 04/05/2021 saying that they were owed £3770 in PPI payments, and that they had a cheque for the caller. The suspects phoned back on 05/05/2021, saying that a solicitor would come to their house that evening with the cheque, but they required a £100 pay safe voucher and proof of ID. The victim has contacted the Claims Advice Bureau independently who confirmed this is a scam. The victim did not suffer any monetary loss.

12/05/2021 19:15 - A vehicle was stopped by Officers on patrol on Muston Road in Filey. The driver failed a road side drugs test so was arrested for this and also possessing a small quantity of cannabis. They were later released from custody pending the result of the blood test and received a warning for the cannabis possession.

13/05/2021 15:15 - A resident received a call from a fraudster pretending to be from the Met Police. They were told their bank account and National Insurance numbers had been cloned. For some reason, they were then asked to withdraw £50 from their bank and buy a £350 Amazon gift card which someone would collect. The victim was aware it was a scam and did not hand out any personal details.

19/05/2021 15:22 - Filey Sports Club report that on the afternoon of 10/05/2021 or 11/05/2021, three youths attempted to break into the shed at the playing fields. The investigation is ongoing.

21/05/2021 11:46 - A theft of 4 bottles of alcohol valued at £60 was reported from Tesco in Filey. The suspects left in a vehicle, enquiries are ongoing to locate the vehicle and occupants.

22/05/2021 21:02 – A disturbance involving several people was reported from The Belle Vue Pub in Filey. Officers attended but the matter had been resolved prior to them arriving.

We received 8 reports of concern for safety of individuals in your ward area during May. These incidents invariably relate to people in distress. We work closely with the Street Triage Mental Health Team at Cross Lane who carry Police radios with them, we also have support from Mental Health professionals who work in our control room. This is sadly becoming an increasing trend but we always ensure the people receive the best help available at the time and refer them to other agencies. If necessary, they are referred into the weekly meeting we have with other agencies from around the Borough where we can discuss courses of action to provide best support.

The average time taken to answer 101 calls in May 2021 was 180 seconds.

During May we dealt with 649 incidents across the area as a whole, a breakdown of these follows (not inclusive of all incidents): -

- 13 injury/death RTCs.
- 17 damage only RTCs.
- 43 road related offences, drink/drug driving, no insurance/license/dangerous driving/speeding etc...
- 56 reports of suspicious circumstances.
- 2 missing persons.
- 1 firearms incident.
- 14 hoax calls.
- 1 Domestic Violence Disclosure Scheme – *commonly referred to as 'Clare's Law' The Scheme was introduced to set out procedures that could be used by the police in relation to disclosure of information about previous violent and abusive offending by a potentially violent individual to their partner where this may help protect them from further violent and abusive offending.*

- 30 domestic incidents/violence.
- 67 concern for safety incidents.
- 8 civil disputes.
- 4 animal incidents
- 10 highway disruptions
- 62 violence crimes.
- 8 sexual offences.
- 14 thefts.
- 2 stolen motor vehicles.
- 17 fraud or forgery.
- 2 drug offences.
- 21 criminal damages.
- 2 dwelling or commercial burglaries.
- 0 auto crimes.
- 65 anti-social behaviour reports.

If an incident of Anti-Social Behaviour occurs which you would like Police to deal with then please report this as soon as possible after the event to allow Officers the best chance to deal with the culprits. Please do not wait until next time you happen to bump into an Officer or Parish Councillor. It allows us to make connections with other incidents and deal with individuals for patterns of behaviour rather than incidents in isolation. It does not matter if no suspects have been seen or cannot be identified; we may have this reported on another nearby incident and be able to link them.
