

## **MONTHLY STATEMENT from MJC of SBC matters relating to Filey**

### **BRIDGE HOLE TOILETS**

At long last, the refurbished and enhanced facility was opened last month. The outstanding items, foot shower and water bottle refilling are due to be installed after the season. The assisted adult changing facility is also scheduled to be installed after the season.

I have been approached on 2 matters in regard to the use of the toilets;

1. What is the situation in regard to school parties having to pay?
2. Does staff from SBC leased kiosks have you pay? Over the full season this adds up to quite an amount for the Lessee.

The responses from SBC:

1. School parties should use the free facilities at Coble Landing or Royal Parade.
2. Yes.

### **CHALETS on ROYAL PARADE**

Regrettably, I have been informed that sufficient funding is not available from the Invest to Save budget for the demolition. This is due to the requirement for the hire charges to be increased by such an amount as to make the project unviable.

I have already told both the Chief Executive and Leader of my disappointment and stated that the continuing situation is a very poor advert for both Filey and SBC.

I have emailed both the Chief Exec and the Leader asking for a meeting. My meeting took place after the recent Extraordinary SBC meeting.

The Chief Executive was on leave so the meeting was attended by the Leader and Deputy Chief Executive.

The Leader confirmed his previous stance that the potential project was not viable from an Invest to Save aspect.

I accepted that an Invest to Save project was not entirely appropriate but stated that I was in receipt of new information, i.e. the fact that a significant sum will have to be spent on the chalets as the roofs need considerable repairs to be undertaken.

I consider this to be a waste of money, far better to replace the whole lot.

The Leader suggested that other funds were available, e.g. the £1 million Investment. He also stated that SBC was waiting for FTC to prioritise which projects it wanted funding from the £1 million.

I replied that SBC Ward members and the Town Council had been asking for some time which projects had been accepted by SBC as being appropriate for funding and the estimated costs of them.

This would then allow proper consideration to be given by the Investment Group. I had previously been promised such a list by the Chief Executive but it was still awaited.

The Deputy Chief Executive promised that the list would be prepared.

I have since been in contact with both the Deputy Chief Executive and the Corporate Finance Manager and have asked for the information prior to the meeting of the Investment Group and the Town Council.

### **SECTION 106 FUND BID**

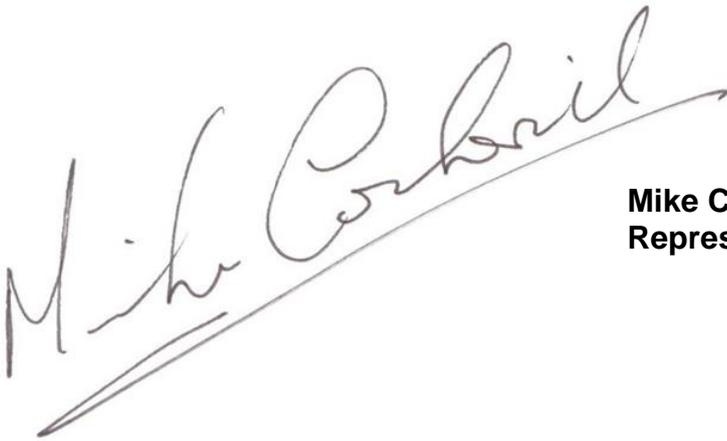
I am pleased that my 2 bids for equipment for the cricket and football clubs have been approved; I thank the Town Council for its support. SBC has ordered the items.
