## May 2021

There were 129 incidents reported in Filey during April.

03/04/2021 23:58 - A youth searched on Station Avenue in Filey was found to have a small quantity of cannabis on them. The youth was interviewed and referred to drug addiction services in an attempt to divert them away from future use. They have since attended this course and complied with the requirements.

04/04/2021 08:32 – The driver of a car failed a breath test on Mitford Street in Filey. They were later charged with the offence of drink driving and bailed to appear at court.

06/04/2021 10:00 - A report was received from St Oswald's graveyard of ornaments being stolen, specifically; a solar powered glass daffodil and pot ceramic red mushroom.

08/04/2021 16:19 - Soap powder and pop tarts were stolen from Heron Foods in Filey. The offender was located by Officers, issued with a Community Resolution Disposal (an out of court settlement) and banned from the store.

08/04/2021 16:27 - Children playing in the Ravine have dislodged a rock which has rolled down and hit a visitors parked car causing damage. The children ran off and could not be located by Officers.

09/04/2021 19:53 - A resident reported an attempted scam over the phone by someone purporting to be from Amazon Prime. The scammers stated someone in California had fraudulently purchased two things on their amazon prime account which Amazon had managed to cancel. The scammer convinced the victim to download a support app on their phone but thankfully there was poor mobile reception so it didn't work. The scammers went on to ask the victim to log on to her lap top and he managed to connect to it. They then started mentioning banking and thankfully the victim realised at this point that it was a scam. These individuals can be very convincing, please don't engage with anyone wanting to download something to your phone or gain access to your computer.

13/04/2021 08:53 - An RTC was reported outside Filey School between a school bus and parked car. The drivers exchanged details.

25/04/2021 11:08 - An incident of criminal damage to a parked car was reported on Ravine Top. Enquiries reveal this to actually be an RTC, Officers assisted in exchanging the details of the relevant parties.

We received 6 reports of concern for safety of individuals in your ward area during April. These incidents invariably relate to people in distress. We work closely with the Street Triage Mental Health Team at Cross Lane who carry Police radios with them, we also have support from Mental Health professionals who work in our control room. This is sadly becoming an increasing trend but we always ensure the people receive the best help available at the time and refer them to other agencies. If necessary, they are referred into the weekly meeting we have with other agencies from around the Borough where we can discuss courses of action to provide best support.

The average time taken to answer 101 calls in April 2021 was 156 seconds.

During April we dealt with 750 incidents across the area as a whole, a breakdown of these follows (not inclusive of all incidents): -

- 11 injury/death RTCs.
- 15 damage only RTCs.
- 42 road related offences, drink/drug driving, no insurance/license/dangerous driving/speeding etc...
- 64 reports of suspicious circumstances.
- 8 missing persons.
- 3 firearms incidents.
- 8 hoax calls.
- 3 Domestic Violence Disclosure Schemes – *commonly referred to as 'Clare's Law' The Scheme was introduced to set out procedures that could be used by the police in relation to disclosure of information about previous violent and abusive offending by a potentially violent individual to their partner where this may help protect them from further violent and abusive offending.*

- 37 domestic incidents/violence.
- 60 concern for safety incidents.
- 8 civil disputes.
- 6 animal incidents
- 24 highway disruptions
- 55 violence crimes.
- 8 sexual offences.
- 17 thefts.
- 0 stolen motor vehicles.
- 18 fraud or forgery.
- 3 drug offences.
- 16 criminal damages.
- 4 dwelling or commercial burglaries.
- 0 auto crimes.
- 151 anti-social behaviour reports.

If an incident of Anti-Social Behaviour occurs which you would like Police to deal with then please report this as soon as possible after the event to allow Officers the best chance to deal with the culprits. Please do not wait until next time you happen to bump into an Officer or Parish Councillor. It allows us to make connections with other incidents and deal with individuals for patterns of behaviour rather than incidents in isolation. It does not matter if no suspects have been seen or cannot be identified; we may have this reported on another nearby incident and be able to link them.

# Derwent & Hertford Rural Watch – May



Here we are, already May with lambing and calving season just about over for most but this is the time when we need to ensure that all dogs should be kept on a lead.

Dogs can easily get excited from all the scents created during lambing and calving and their “animal instincts” can kick in. This can lead to dogs scaring and/or chasing lambs, ewes and calves and the effects are both horrific and upsetting for farmers, not to mention the financial impact! All dog owners, now that restrictions are lifting, should remember to keep their dogs leashed at all times, especially when near livestock. Should your beloved pooch be caught harassing livestock, the farmer has every right to **shoot** it if proved his animals have been hurt.



And if you are walking through fields where cows have calves – ensure you know what you are doing as cows can cause serious injury if spooked!! Keep to the edge of the field and keep your animals leashed at all times for your own safety; **IF** part of the herd seems to be paying you interest, get out of the field as quickly as possible.

Enjoy the rural countryside but know its (and your) limitations as it can also be a dangerous place.

**Poaching** – poachers come in many guises, not just after deer; they kill birds (pheasants and grouse mostly), mammals (deer, rabbits and hares mostly), and fish (carp, salmon, trout and freshwater mussels). Poaching and poachers not only takes the prey, they also devastate crops and livelihoods as well as meaning farmers can come face-to-face with armed trespassers!

We all know the areas where we live – especially this past year or so where we have taken walks/horse rides out along rural pathways and fields. It is **important** that you report any vehicle that is parked alongside a field that is unknown in the area immediately to the Police.

If you cannot report it straight away due to poor phone signal take note of where you are and as soon as you get into a good signal area, call it in to 101 or if on-going dial 999; what you must **not** do is approach anyone yourself in case they turn violent toward you. Your safety is extremely important!
