

FILEY TOWN COUNCIL – USE AND OPERATION OF MEMORIAL GARDENS FILEY POLICY

Introduction

1. Filey Town Council (“the Council”) is committed to ensure that the garden is maintained and operates in the same manner as set out at the time, 1921, of the garden’s creation. This was to provide a Memorial to The Service personnel of Filey who had died in the First World War. This principle has continued throughout the ensuing years with the addition of other Filey Service personnel who have lost their lives in subsequent conflicts.
2. This policy explains how the Council, its councillors and staff will work with all concerned to maintain this objective.

Use of the Gardens

3. The Gardens may be used as a location for any memorial service or activity that is with respect to the commemoration of an event relating to service personnel, i.e., Remembrance Day Service and Yorkshire Day.
4. Any person or organisation wishing to stage an appropriate event in the Garden must contact the Town Clerk who will provide them with an application form which must be completed prior to consideration by the Town Council.
5. The flying of proper flags from the Flagpole in the Memorial Gardens is permissible as long as prior permission has been granted by the Council. Flags considered appropriate are those of the UK and countries forming the UK, North Yorkshire Council and any other County flag, Filey Town Council, any Riding of Yorkshire, any flag of Her Majesty’s Forces, The Armed Forces Day Flag together with the British Legion.
6. No new logos, signs or posters associated with organisations will be allowed to be sited in the Garden.
